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> This to refer the letter you have sent to Mr. Sahai, Director General, FIEO. The same have been forwarded to me for my comments.

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> I would like to inform you this is too premature to levy UDF to passengers using AAI terminal. Cochin has already rolled back the charges. The present charge of Rs. 280/- is quite reasonable. If it is increased it will affect the common man who is struggling for an air travel. Airlines have to levy on the ticket Aeronautical revenue and other revenues are quite enough for Airport Authority to cover their investments. AAI is not a private body. Private airport holders are levying to make profit. AAI as a public sector Company should not follow the suit of private company. They have to work for the common man and low income group who cannot have an expensive air travel. We have 1.2 billion people. Even 2 percentage is not flying. 1% are corporate and government employees and Other 1% is forced to travel since they are working in foreign countries.

Our minister always tells let the common man fly. If AAI (PSU) is not friendly with common man how can he fly? As per minister's wish the AAI/MOCA should liberalize the policy to keep the airline cost lower, so that they can keep the ticket fair lower for the common man to fly and increase the revenue on voleam
